To: All Michigan Mutual Brokers

Re: Rescission Period – Legal Public Holidays

As a reminder, Sunday, July 4, 2010, is a legal public holiday in observance of Independence Day; therefore, this day should not be included in the borrower’s rescission period or used as a disbursement day.

Monday, July 5, 2010 is considered a business day and must be included in the borrowers three-day rescission period. However, Michigan Mutual Inc will be closed on July 5, 2010 in observance of the July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday.

The rescission period begins the day the loan documents are signed and continues for three business days.

Monday through Saturday are considered business days and are counted as part of the rescission period. Sundays and the legal public holidays specified below are not included in the rescission period.
